Emerald Class

As you may have seen we have invested in some new spelling books. These were suggested by a parent in our parent's afternoon tea session and we think they are a great idea to support the children. They will have their spelling words for the week stuck in each week. The idea is that they should look at each word, say it, then turn the page and have a go at writing it. Repeat for all of the week's words. Then they can check each word is correct. There are two columns to practice in this way in the book each week, although obviously they can practice elsewhere as they would have done before! When we test them in school, it will be on the column that says 'can you remember last week's words?' Please bear in mind that we do not test in the order that the spellings are on the list, so it is good for the children to practice their words out of order at home too. This will enable you to see how your child has done and support them with any spellings that they did not get right.
