Forest schools

Last week we looked at the different colours that we could find outside. This week I would like you to think about the different textures you can find. Are the objects rough or smooth? Do they feel soft or spiky? Perhaps you could have a go at grouping what you find, similar to the work we have been doing in science.

You could draw pictures of the items you find and label it with adjectives to describe them. If the items are loose objects, you could create images from just one texture. For example, only smooth or only spiky.



This spiky hedgehog has been made from short, rough sticks.



This feathered bird has been created using crisp leaves.

You might also like to take some rubbings of different textures. A great activity I enjoy doing is bark rubbing. Hold, or tape, a piece of paper to the trunk of a tree. Then, using the long side of a crayon, gently rub to show the pattern of the bark underneath. You can also take rubbings from leaves as well. (Make sure that the leaves are dry)
