Forest schools


This week in forest schools we are going to think about the different colours that we can see outside. We are going to go on a colour hunt. The idea of the colour hunt is to find colours in nature that match the colours on your rainbow cards. You do not need to pick anything, simply hold your card up to the thing that you have found. Show a grown up what you have found and talk about what you notice. Is the colour dark or light, bright or dull?

Before going on your hunt, you will need to make some rainbow cards. Here are some ways that you could create them.

<u>Recycled rainbow cards</u> Cut different coloured pieces of card from recycled items in your house. You could use old cereal boxes, postcards or greetings cards.

Paint chart rainbow cards

You may have some old paint chart strips at home that you could use to match against the items that you find.



If you don't have any coloured card to use, you could colour your own squares to take outside with you on your hunt. You could use felt pen, crayon or paint to make these.
