	To write a postcard.	On the next page, the children have been sailing and discovered a cave. Imagine what could be in that cave! Henry thinks pirates might have used it. What could be inside that cave -more shipwrecks, gold and treasure, sparkling gems, bats or seagulls? Does it have water all the way in or is there a dry area for storage?	Think about what it would be like inside the cave - cool, damp, cold and dark. Use a thesaurus or this link https://www.thesaurus.com/ to find synonyms for those words and note down your favourite ones. This will help you to create atmosphere in your writing. Google search for famous caves and click on images to get ideas for what the cave might look like inside. Now turn on your torch and wander inside the cave. How are you feeling; nervous, excited or scared? You are going to write a postcard to Grandma telling her all about the cave. Remember to start with Dear Grandma and sign off with your name. Don't forget to include some of those words you found to create atmosphere. If you have time, you could draw a front for the postcard.
