
Week beginning 13.07.20	Reception daily learning tasks Maths: Please call school to arrange collection of your 'Power Maths' book. Do a page every day. You could then develop the skills you have been working on using www.topmarksmaths.co.uk, try to go on hit the button each day to improve your times tables or number bonds. Don't forget you can go on 'Doodle' too.
	School is open every day, so if you would like more reading books just call the office to arrange a time to collect them.
	<b>PE:</b> Try to do something active each day. Joe Wicks is hosting PE lessons, which you can join in with. You can find this on Youtube. There are many other similar activities you could try, from yoga to home workouts, from the safety of your home.
Monday	Science Over the next two weeks we will be looking at hygiene - staying clean to stay healthy. Watch this video about germ busting - https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=07YNCFIS0iI. Germs are tiny living things that can make us sick. They are so tiny we need a microscope to see them, so you can't see them on your hands! That is why it is so important to wash our hands regularly. Watch this video to show why we must use soap! https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=_KirHm_sYfI. You could try this at home if you have the equipment.

	Talk about these questions: Why should we wash our hands after blowing our nose? What happens if we don't? How would germs in snot be spread? What are 3 top tips to prevent other people catching your cold? Create a poster to encourage regular hand washing with soap – remember to include when you should wash your hands.	
Tuesday	Forest school Create your own magical miniature garden! This week we are going to make a miniature garden. It could be a fairy garden place for dinosaurs, witches and wizards or anyone else you can think of! Get container of some kind, like a plastic container used for fruits, an old empty p pot or anything else you can find. In your outdoor space, collect any materials you want to use, moss, stones, sticks, pine cones etc. and get creative! You could use moss as a base for your miniature world like this:	
	Paint stones for houses or as characters (felt tips work well too) or create a water feature. If you can, take a photo of your creation and send it to the school office. Don't forget to play in your miniature garden! You could bring out some toys or little animals/people and create your own fantasy world.	



	Think about where you live. What is it like? What can you do there? How is St. Ives different or similar to where you live? Write about how the two places are the same and different.
