#### Please by aware

With the end of term in sight, I wanted you to know what you should do in terms of contacting the school if your child tests positive for COVID19 during the Christmas break. You should contact me by email <a href="mailto:head@salhouse.norfolk.sch.uk">head@salhouse.norfolk.sch.uk</a> if your child receives a positive test. School can then support the track and trace system. I will be contactable between 18th December and 23rd December and from 27th December until the start of term. Hopefully we will all stay safe and well through the holiday period.

# News form Norfolk Library Service Reopening – to share with children and families.

We are pleased to have be able to reopen our libraries on December 2<sup>nd</sup> under the tier 2 restrictions. We are really looking forward to welcoming you back to the library in the run up to Christmas and we hope our book collections can see everybody through the holiday period. We very much hope to see you back in the library again soon!

You will find the same measures to keep you safe as before:

- The library has limited capacity for customers allowed in to make sure we can maintain social distance. This means you may be asked to queue outside before we can allow you in
- We are taking test and trace details on entry and we have a QR code on display outside if you would rather use that.
- You will be asked to wear your face covering and sanitise your hands on entry and then follow the one way system inside.
- All our staff are wearing masks and are frequently washing and sanitising their hands too.
- When books are returned, we are quarantining them for 72 hours so that they are safe for our customers to borrow.
- All our touch points and self-service machines are kept clean throughout the day.

The children have really enjoyed outdoor learning this term, retelling stories, counting conkers in ones and tens and creating clay characters on the school trees. We have been very lucky to receive a donation of some crates and guttering for our outside area. The children have been very creative building ball runs, waterways, making a boat and now a sleigh for Father Christmas!

We stay outside nearly all day on a Monday and now that it is winter, it is really important that the children have appropriate clothes. Normal school uniform and a coat are not enough for long stays outside in winter. Please make sure your child has extra layers to wear, some gloves and a hat. We stay outside even if it is raining so a waterproof with a hood is essential. We have some all-in-one waterproof suits in school that the children can use if they don't have one or forget to bring it, but these are not padded so layers are a must. In this cold weather the best clothing is a padded/fleece lined all-in-one waterproof suit. These can be purchased on Amazon and keep the children warm and dry all day. We go outside to learn on other days too and Reception children have outdoor learning daily so it would be great if they all had warm clothes to wear everyday. If it snows, like it did the other day, we will go outside to enjoy the experience! Waterproof gloves are ideal in this situation, as little hands become cold very quickly when playing with snow! Thank you for supporting us by providing the clothes your children need to enjoy being outdoors.

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
