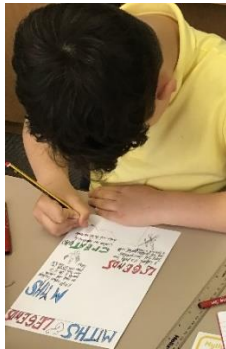

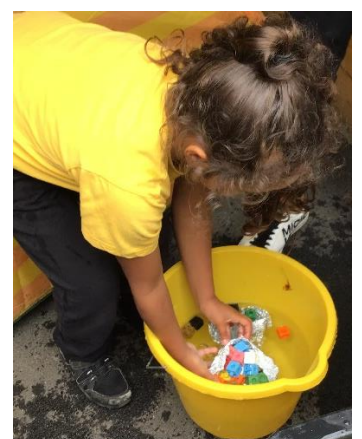

### E – Safety

Online video can be pre-recorded (like YouTube) or 'livestreamed' in real time (using apps like Twitch, or social media platforms like Instagram and Facebook).

YouTube is the biggest and most widely used video service. Over 400 hours of video are uploaded to YouTube every minute, so there is a wealth of great content that kids can access. Of course, there is also inappropriate content and parents have a couple of options to control what children can watch.

YouTube Kids is an app-based approach, available for both Android and Apple IOS devices. Aimed at younger users, it uses a mix of automated Google filters (who own YouTube), review by moderation teams and feedback from parents.

For older children, or use on a wider range of devices, YouTube Restricted Mode in an additional setting which, can be enabled on the YouTube website and app. If enabled it restricts the availability of potentially mature or objectionable content.

### Sports Fun

It has been so long since we have been able to invite parents into school. There are still understandably clear guidelines about what we can and cannot do, but I am pleased to say we will have a sports event for each class. One adult per child is invited to come onto the school field to cheer their child on as they take part in athletic activities led by Mrs Glover.

Emerald Class Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> July 2.30pm start. Parents can arrive from 2.20pm.

Diamond Class Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> July 2.15pm Start. Parents can arrive from 2.05pm.

To ensure the event is Covid safe and operates within guidance, the following control measures will be in place:

- Enter via the Village Hall gate.
- One adult per child (we do understand that young siblings may need to be with you but if you can easily make other childcare arrangements it would help)
- Please bring in a completed Track and Trace form (attached)
- Parents will be seated and we ask that you remain seated
- We ask that parents follow the Hands – Face – Space advice that we are all so used to
- If the toilet is needed, staff will give you access to the staff toilet in the school office area.
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At the end of the event please wait in the normal place near the Village Hall carpark and we will bring the children out as usual.

Even though we have this list of control measures, I do hope you enjoy being part of the event. Fingers crossed for good weather.
