Dear Parents and Carers,

WELCOME TO DIAMOND CLASS - OR WELCOME BACK FOR OTHERS!

At the beginning of the school year, I thought it might be useful to let you know what life in Diamond Class will be like this year. I'm sure together we can make it the best possible experience.

## HOMEWORK

We will not be setting homework or spellings for the first week so that the pupils have time to settle first. The first set of homework will be sent home on Friday 8<sup>th</sup> September and will be due in on Friday 15<sup>th</sup> September. Hopefully, this letter will explain how this will work.

Your child will be given a plastic wallet in which their homework books, reading book and spellings can travel between home and school.

Homework will be set on Friday and should be returned to school on the following Friday. The homework will be three books - an English, a Maths and a Times Tables 10 minute weekly workout. Each week, your child should complete one double page workout, starting with Autumn Term Workout 1. Please help ensure your child brings their folder in every Friday as they will only be marked on that day. There is a timetable of dates and which workout you should be completing stuck in the homework book to help.

Spellings will also be sent home on a Friday to be learned by the next Friday. The pupils will stick their spellings in their own book. They have space in the book to practice the spellings twice in the week and a house point will be awarded to those that do this.

Pupils will choose a reading book for in class and we will also send one home that can stay at home until they have finished reading it. It can then be returned to school to swap for a new book. The pupils who are free readers can do this themselves as soon as they have finished it.

Please do help your child with homework, especially initially to set up good working routines and to make sure homework is back in school on time. Hopefully together, we can ensure that homework is a positive learning experience.

## Forest Schools

For the first half term on Thursday afternoons, Diamond class will have Forest School lessons run by Little Explorers. Our first session will be Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> September. Pupils may wear

their school uniform or can bring suitable clothes to get changed in to before the lesson. Trainers or wellies may be worn for these sessions. Please consider the weather on Thursdays and send waterproofs, including waterproof trousers, if it is forecast to rain.

## PE

PE is on Wednesday every week, and on Thursdays after half term when Forest Schools finishes, and this term it will be games skills and cross-country. Pupils in Diamond class get changed for PE so please ensure there is a kit in school for your child on these days. These lessons will initially take place outside on the playground or field so your child will need appropriate PE kit. School PE kit consists of a yellow T-shirt, navy/black shorts, trainers with good grip (no black pumps and the trainers need to be different to those they wear during the day) and a warm navy/black tracksuit for cold weather. A shower proof jacket is also needed for those odd showers.

## CURRICULUM

For the first two weeks of term we will be exploring how best we all learn and techniques that can help. These are the questions we use in class so please use them at home too!

**Is this similar to a previous task?**

**What do I want to achieve?**

**What should I do first?**

**Am I on the right track?**

**What could I do differently?**

**What could I have done better?**

**Who can I ask for help?**

**What worked well?**

**What could I have done better?**

**Can I apply this to other situations?**

**Why did I enjoy that?**

**What am I learning?**

**How will I know I am doing well?**

**What will I do if I get stuck or find it hard?**

**What are my next steps?**

We will also be exploring our school values of respect, responsibility, courage, trust, perseverance and compassion, and of course getting to know each other!

After that, our topic for the rest of the term will be The Romans and then The Circus and we will also be exploring the geography of the UK, Italy and Africa. The curriculum plan for the topic is attached explaining all that we will be learning. Please could you encourage your child to look for any information on these topics and you can be as creative as you like!

In Year 3 English, they will be studying Roman stories and Roald Dahl's BFG. They will be writing their own stories and non-chronological reports. For Year 4, 5 and 6, in English this term we will be focussing on autobiographical writing from reading Roald Dahl's book 'Boy' and fictional writing from the book 'Danny the champion of the world'. We will be making predictions, exploring characters and settings, and it will culminate in writing a short story. We will also use the book for inspiration for our writing to produce a diary entry and a newspaper report. We will studying 'Leon -the place between' and writing haiku poems after half term. English work will be linked to topic lessons too. Pupils will continue to be

encouraged to read a range of own choice books and discuss their thoughts and ideas about these.

In Maths we will begin the year with a unit on place value then continue to concentrate on calculations and the application of these. We will also cover shape, measurement (including time), fractions and decimals. Please can you practise all times tables with your child, as there is now an expectation that pupils know to 12 x 12 by the end of year 4 and there is the statutory assessment of these at the end of the year. We will of course continue to practise times tables in class too.

Should you ever have any worries or concerns, please do not hesitate to make an appointment to speak to me. I am usually available before and after school. Hopefully with us all working together, we can have a fantastic term and ensure that your child, or children, get the most out of Diamond Class life.
